teacher, school, house

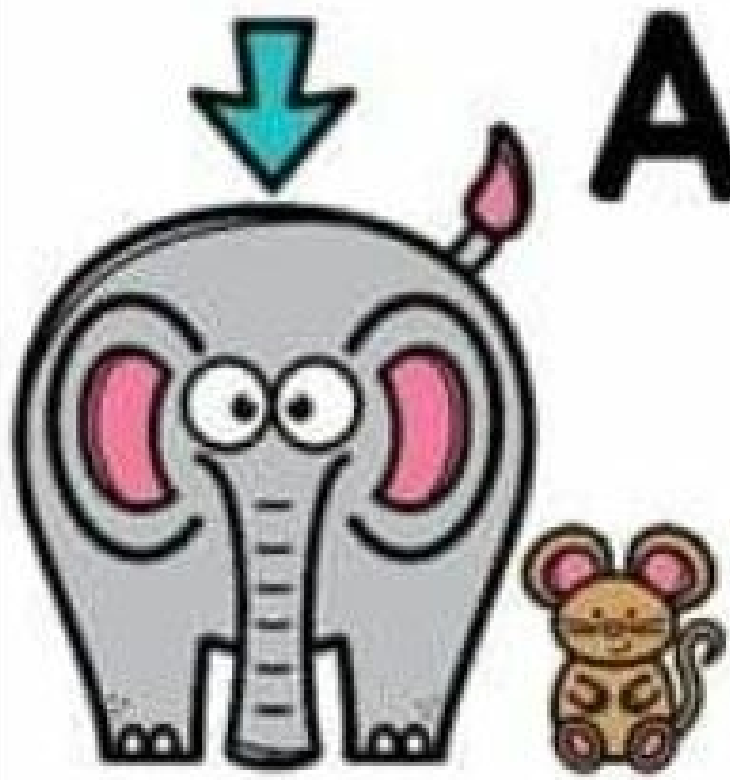
Pronoun

Earth Structure



The Earth is like a giant, layered cake.
It has five main layers.

1. **Continental Crust** - This is the outer layer where we live. It's like the frosting on the cake. It's thin and hard.
2. **Oceanic crust** - lies beneath the ocean, consisting mainly of dense, basaltic rocks and forming the ocean floor.
3. **Mantle** - Below the crust is the mantle, which is like the cake's sponge. It's thicker and can flow slowly, kind of like thick, gooey syrup.
4. **Outer Core** - Beneath the mantle is the outer core, which is very hot and liquid, like melted chocolate. It's made of metals like iron and nickel.
5. **Inner Core** - At the very center is the inner core, which is solid and very hot, like a super-heated metal ball.
